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### THE SCHOOL DAY

All classrooms doors open at 8.40am. Children must be in school by 9.00am. After 8.50am you must enter school via the main entrance and school office. School finishes at 3.20pm, all children are collected at their classroom doors.

The staff find it really helpful when parents queue as most of you do. It helps them to ensure that the children have gone home safely. We would politely ask the Willow parents to queue along the fence and down the main entrance path to help with this (staff will be around to help guide you).

Please be punctual and help your child to arrive on time for school. A late start can cause anxiety and of course vital learning time is lost.

### PICK UP ARRANGEMENTS

Please inform the class teacher/office in the morning when you drop off your child if they will be going home with another parent or carer. If this person is not known to school you must provide a password. Please be patient with staff if they need to check arrangements as they are following safeguarding procedures.

### PARKING

Please do not park in the staff carpark at any time unless you have a special permission. Please park considerately i.e. not on grass verges, not blocking driveways or entrances to school, not on the yellow zigzag lines and not in the private parking bays on Hassop Close. There is a carpark by the playing field next to Stonelow Junior School that can be used. This option relieves congestion on The Avenue. These requests are to help keep everyone safe and to strengthen our already positive relationships with the local community.

### ILLNESS, APPOINTMENTS, ABSENCE FROM SCHOOL

If your child is ill, needs to leave school or arrives late for any reason including dental or medical appointments you MUST let the school office know.

## NO DOGS

We have a no dog policy on our school site please. Do not leave your dog tied up at either school entrance please. This is for health and safety reasons. Some of our children and grown-ups are frightened of dogs.

## SCHOOL MEALS

Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 children are entitled to a free school meal. Children will choose what they are having for lunch during morning registration. If your child would like to swap from packed lunches to school meals or vice versa, the kitchen requires two weeks' notice.

## PE KIT

All children come to school wearing their PE Kits on PE days. Please wear white tops and dark shorts/joggers/ and school sweatshirts. Your teacher will let you which day your child is having PE.





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## OUTDOOR CLOTHING

Please ensure your child wears the appropriate clothing for outdoors depending on the weather. Coats should be waterproof and have a hood. Reception children need waterproofs and wellingtons in school. **Please name all clothing.**

## SUN SAFETY

Please ensure that in hot weather your child comes to school with sun protection cream already applied. We suggest the Factor 50 once a day. Your child can top up the cream but they have to do this without adult support, which can be tricky!

## WHAT TO BRING EACH DAY

A NAMED water bottle and book bag each day. Packed lunch bag if required. Please no toys in school. Children can **only bring water** to school, no juice or fizzy drinks, these will be disposed of and water will be given instead.

## OUTDOOR EQUIPMENT

Please ensure you supervise your child/ren, at all times before and after school when on the school grounds. We politely ask you not to let the children use the outdoor areas directly outside the classrooms and nursery. School staff are not responsible for your children before school starts and when school finishes.

## VOLUNTEERS

We will be asking for volunteers in school soon. This will be on Tuesday and Thursday afternoons between 1.30pm and 3.15pm. Please look out for further information
