

What is the phonic screening?

The phonics screening check happens in Year 1 and is a short, light touch assessment to confirm whether individual children have learnt phonic decoding to an appropriate standard. The test takes place in June. The checks consist of 40 words and non-words (sometimes called alien or pseudo words). Your child will be asked to read these on a one-to-one basis with a teacher. There is no time limit to the phonic screening. The pass rate for the last couple of years has been 32. However this could change.

It will identify any children who may need some extra help so that support can be given to help improve their reading skills. They will be able to retake the check in Year 2 if needed.

How can I help my child at home?

Practice a mix of non-words (alien) and real words. Ask your child to draw sound buttons underneath each sound to help identify the sounds. During the test there is blank paper which children can use to write the word and apply sound buttons on.

Practice segmenting and blending by sounding out the words individually and then putting them together.


Continue reading books will help children to practice segmenting and blending and play games with your child using phonics.
